




Feedback Survey


An electronic survey was conducted post event with a response rate received of 30% of all attendees.



















































KARIEGA CAREERS SYMPOSIUM

FOUNDERS' DAY ASSEMBLY – Friday 5 August 2022

This was the moment that many Old Muirites, current scholars, staff and friends of Muir were waiting for.

Because of the large numbers in attendance (approximately 1200), the school hall was temporarily extended into the quad with an overhead tent to protect from the elements.

The assembly opened with a procession of Old Muirites, who live in various countries, carrying the flag of their current country into the hall.







Each of the classes who were celebrating large reunions, were acknowledged. Also in attendance was an Old Muirite who is 91 years of age who came specifically for the Assembly.

One of the highlights of the Assembly was the singing of the school anthem with a cross over to Algoa FM at the same time, thus broadcasting the song to listeners throughout the Eastern Cape.





After the assembly the Laying of the Wreaths took place, with The Last Post being played on the bugle and the flags raised to mark the moment.

The Heritage Association of South Africa awarded Muir College with a plaque to officially recognize the school on reaching 200 years of education.

There were a variety of age groups participating: Under 13s, under 15s and First Teams.

Highlights on the Saturday included the SA Rugby Legends taking on the Old Muirite Rugby Legends as the curtain raiser for the main games. Sadly, the SA Rugby Legends beat the Old Muirite Legends 12-34.

The Old Muirite Rugby Legends were led onto the field by Old Boy and ex-Springbok Rugby Player, Garth Wright. The lead referee was Jeremy Schauder, Class of 1978 and referee for Israel's National Team.

After this game Queens College took on Graeme College for their annual Derby Game, with the score being 22-19 for Graeme College.

The last game of the day, and the most anticipated game, was between Muir College first team and Grey High School first team. This is the first time that these 2 schools have played against each other in almost 2 decades. Muir was well in the lead up until the nail-biting 2nd half when Grey came back strongly to win 29-23.
